An Open "letter" to Moms and Dads!

I know you want to be a good father or good mother.

Most moms and dads do. I think that even those who are not good parents actually want to be, they just don't know how. Good parenting is a skill that some have naturally, while for others they have to learn it. For example some people are good drivers, it comes naturally to them. Others will most likely be bad drivers and will remain bad drivers their whole life. There is not much you can do for them except stay out of their way when they get behind the wheel. Or some people have a natural gift for mechanics, while other have to learn the skill. Of course when they learn mechanic skills they may excel. I think parenting is the same way, some are born with the "gift," while others have to learn the skill by observation and discernment. Good parents may have learned good parenting from a mom and dad who were good and caring parents. Others may have, likewise, learned poor parenting skills from their

folks who themselves had poor parenting skills.

Sometimes people will be aware that they did not learn good parenting skills from their parents and so they will seek out mentors to watch and learn. Then others are stubborn and prideful and won't learn anything. Some will read good Christian books on parenting. One thing for sure, no one is a perfect parent. So children, if you are reading this, forgive your parents when they mess up, as you want to be forgiven when you mess up. We all are born with short comings and we all have flaws. Finding a good mentor really isn't that difficult. Observe parents who have produced children who have become good adults. Do not choose as your mentor moms and dads whose children are little and not yet grown. They may seem like good mentors but you can't tell what their parenting skills will produce until you see the

finished product - that is grown children. So chose as your mentors moms and dads whose kids have grown into good wholesome, mature, Christ loving adults.

Of course, sometimes it seems like children are rebellious from the womb. So be careful not to judge too harshly. An additional word of counsel for those who have children at home. Your children are watching and learning from you. If you want your children to be caring and loving to you when you get old, then you need to make sure you are caring, loving and respectful to your parents. Because your children are watching you and they will treat YOU exactly the way you treat your parents. They are learning from you. Of course this doesn't always work out, but it is a good solid place to start.

So moms and dads want to be good parents, you want them to learn various polite social skills. You want them to display what the Apostle Paul in Galatians 5:22-23 said were the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Of course an unruly spirit will produce other kinds of fruit. Fruit that will lead to a difficult life, a life far out of control like we read about in the story of the Prodigal Son, who couldn't find happiness (though

he tried) until he went back home to his father. That is why Jesus says, "Come unto me all of you who are suffering a heavy burden and I will give you rest."

So wise moms and dads will show their children the Lord. But keep in mind - the *first images of the Lord* will be in how you live your life. The words you use, the spirit in which you handle difficulty, the friends you have in your circle, your character, integrity all send important messages to your children.

In your life and conduct do your children see a mom or dad that is guided by principal. A man or woman of principal will show strength when facing decisions which may not be convenient but the division of right and wrong is clearly visible.

Moms and dads want their children to love them but it is equally important that they respect them. They need to respect their strength of character. Moms and dads need to understand their children can't learn the character revealed in the fruit of the spirit by simply telling them. They must *see them* in your life by the way you live each day.

Of course, being a mom and dad is sort of like being a preacher. We try to tell people how to live a perfect life knowing all along that it is something we can't do ourselves.

The Apostle Paul was aware of this human flaw and in great length describes his anguish in Romans 7 and then concludes in verse 24 "O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?"

However, moms and dads are still under the command to raise a child in the way of the Lord with patience and love and also by example in their own lives. When my wife and I were raising our children we knew that the concept of grace was an important lesson for children to learn. So through simple lessons in their own lives we wanted them to have a childhood grasp of the grace we receive from the atoning blood of Jesus Christ. So, for that reason, sometimes when they were to be punished I would say to them, "You know you disobeyed, don't you? They would acknowledge their disobedience and I would say

to them. "You know you deserve to be punished, don't you?"

Children aren't stupid! They know!

But then I would tell them that I will give them grace. And explain what it means.

I didn't do it a lot. Otherwise grace would lose it's meaning.

Romans 6:1 "Well then, should we keep on sinning so that God can show us more and more of his wonderful grace? 2 Of course not! Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it?"

So moms and dads want to raise children that have learned to put their trust in the Lord.

But! There is a problem.

Mom and dad, *listen!* You can't do it alone! Well, I guess maybe you can but it is a lot harder. Like a police officer in a "sticky" situation - you need backup! You need others who will help strengthen your teaching. This is why you need to have your children in church.

All week long are work days, but on Sunday you and your children need to be IN church. Going to church should not be something you do only when there is nothing else to do. They need to see that you take your Christian faith seriously - that you place value in it. They also need to see that you chose to bring other Christians into "your circle." Of course you are to be friendly to all, but those you bring into your circle will have influence on the lives of your children. So choose your friends carefully. Also choose carefully the movies you watch, the books you read and the music you listen to.

The church is there for that purpose. The Bible says (Romans 10:17) that "faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."

In this wicked demonic world that has descended upon us, it is important that you and your children are in church.

But there is a problem. Keep reading and I will get to the



I mentioned at the beginning.

Where is the church that is suitable for your children?

OK, I am going to close this up really quick and my closing will probably cause confusion for some of you.

The confusion is because there is a massive failure to understand the blood connection our people have with the Abrahamic Covenant.

The people of Israel, children of that wonderful

covenant God made with Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Jacob and ALL their generations are the same people that populated the nations of Europe. They, us, we, them, Europeans, Israel, White people, are all one and the same people. We are the children of the Covenant.

Of course, you should ask the preacher before attending if they believe race-mixing is a sin. If they say "No" then don't go to that church and if you are already going then get out and

keep that preacher away from your children!

Remember: Miscegenation is as much a sexual perversion as Sodomy!

If he says "Yes" then ask him to preach a sermon about the sin of miscegenation. If he is afraid to do that then he probably lied to you and was just saying "yes" because he thought that it was the answer you wanted to hear, but he doesn't really believe it.

If there is no church in your city that is faithful to the commandment of loving your people then you may have to drive to one in another city.

If that is the case then it will most likely be too far for a weekly attendance, Or you may even consider moving. After all, people will move to have a better job. Maybe moving to have a better Christian environment for your children is actually more important.

If the church is a long distance you should make the decision that though you can't drive there every week, you will schedule your life to take your family once a month. Here at the Christian Revival Center we hold a pot luck dinner on the first Sunday of each month. There are those who bring their family once a month for the potluck, worship service and fellowship. But you need to be *connected* to a church body - people who can encourage you and can be mentors to your children. Remember - you need backup!

Maybe you live so far away that even once a month is a burden. OK, make the commitment for every other month, or every three months. I am sure you understand the point I am making.

If travel is totally out of the question, you could do what some others are doing. Have church in your home. Actually that is where the early church in the days of apostles met. We have our sermons on line at ChristianRevivalCenter.net. You can listen to them anytime. But don't do that - have church in your home. Have a scheduled time to meet for church. Gather your family together and perhaps sing some songs then listen to the online sermon, each week at a *scheduled time*. There are probably people you know who are angry with the growing hatred against White Christians and may want to come over for church in your home.

OK! HERE'S THE WARNING!

Dear mom and dad be careful you **don't get captured** by the allure of a church that seems to say all the right things about the social corruption we see in our nation. Actually there are many churches like that, but the over whelming majority will not take a stand in defense of our children's racial integrity.

Too much to write about that now, but these churches are a part of the One World Church and offer no opposition to white genocide.

The danger (the warning) is that these churches seem like the real thing with good solid Christian morals and teachings. But that is where the deception comes in. The One World Church will trap your children if you go there for very long. The One World Church is powerfully

deceptive.
