
We have a picture here of a girl in an athletic event. There are three things we can tell from this picture. #1 She is in a running competition. #2 She is tired. #3 She

isn't going to win the race!

How do I know that? because it is obvious she didn't cross the finish line, she didn't finish the race, *she got tired and quit*. She just wasn't prepared to run the long distance. The author of Hebrews tells us that if we want to win a race we have to put aside every thing that may slow us down. For example, if you want to run with work boots, fine, but you won't win the race. This race of life is worth letting go of things that could slow us down. Hebrews 12:1 "Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us." We are told to run with *patience*. In other words, have endurance. It may be tough but don't quit. Stay in the race.

The Apostle Peter tells us that the inability to remain faithful (endure) is so disgusting it is like a dog eating his own vomit.

"For if after they have escaped the postilions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again



entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning.21 For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them. 22 But it happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned again to his own vomit," 2 Peter 2:20-22.

As you can see, I highlighted the word, entangled. Because this seems to be where people get in trouble. They have a hard time disconnecting from the world. The ways of the world are captivating and enticing, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world." 2 John 2:15-16

What does he mean - "Don't Love the world." I don't think it means what many generally think it means: drunkenness, wild living etc. I am sure that would be a part of it, however, I believe he is telling us to be careful not to be trapped in pursuits that do not advance the Kingdom of God or as we might say it today, does not advance the message of White Christian Revival. Simply put - be careful of your priorities. These priorities would not be something we would generally classify as sin, but things which detour us away from our greater mission of seeking the Kingdom of God. Christ said, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God," Matt 6:33.

Many people get caught up in rituals. In fact sinful man loves church rituals because it helps to make them feel righteous. This can become a problem with religion - it has a tendency to create self-righteousness. If you are not careful, religion will convince you that you are righteous because you have the "right" doctrines. You worship on the "right" day, you take communion at the "right" time. You use the "right" name for God. You keep the "right" holidays. You eat the "right" foods.

Of course there are other things a church may encourage you to do because it seems like the right things to do.

Your greatest obligation isn't to keep church rituals or church laws, but it is to love the Sheep. In fact that was the theme of the "test" Jesus gave Peter which is recorded in John 21. Jesus asked Peter, Do you love me? And the answer was, "yes," but then Jesus challenged him that if you loved him then you are to love or "feed" God's sheep. We are told that if you don't love the sheep then you really do not love God.

Now I want us to look at this verse 9 in Gal 6. "And let us not be weary in well doing, for in due season we shall reap if we faint not."

When pursuing a righteous cause - don't give up.

That was the trouble with the girl we pictured on page one, she got weary and she quit whereas if she would have endured she would have finished the race. But she didn't properly prepare herself. That is the message for today - FINISH the race!

God has given us that wonderful covenant recorded in Gen 12, 17. If we say we love God but don't love the children of the covenant - our brothers and sisters then we are deceived and don't really love God. 1 John 1:9 - "Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates a brother or sister is still in the darkness."

Of course, the one world church is centered on this deception that loving our people is racist and not spiritual. Over the years I have seen many people who will embrace this love of race, faith and homeland, but they do not protect their faith, they remain entangled with the world.

If they don't stay plugged in they will usually drift away after 3-5 years. Some a little sooner and some a little longer, but 3-5 years is what seems to be the average. Sometimes people drift away because they have simply grown tired of the rejection. They think this new found love of race, faith and homeland should be embraced by everyone. And it should be, but it is not. So they become discouraged, perhaps their overzealous enthusiasm has alienated them from their friends. I tell people, slow down, get grounded - let your roots grow deep.

Christ talks about this is the parable of the sower.

Some of his seed fell on the rocks and were scorched by the sun. Others fell upon the open ground

and was eaten by birds, some was choked by the weeds and briers. Then some fell among good ground.

The saddest one are the people who just grow weary.

They want to be strong, they want to testify to the world, and they want to be faithful, but they grew weary. Why? it is because they tried to keep one foot in the world. They didn't fully disconnect themselves and became entangled again with the world.

This is why fellowship with others is so important.

Because I can almost assure you that if you do not keep connected in fellowship with others you will drift away. And when I say - keep in fellowship - I don't mean with Christians who are themselves trapped in the One World Church - because the one world church will actually **cause** you to drift away. Because it looks real, sounds real and even feels real. But It doesn't love our people.

The one world church will tell us that everyone is welcome to come. This welcome mat is extended to people who are not of the covenant (non whites). You will hear them teaching their children that Jesus loves all the children of the world, "Red and yellow, black and white." If your children are being taught this then are being groomed for the one world church.

They want to present Jesus with his arms wide open to receive the whole world. But the reality is that Jesus said the way to life is a narrow road.

"Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it." Matt 7:13-14

Instead of showing Jesus with his hands wide apart indicating wide acceptance, perhaps images should show him with his hands and arms close together to indicated the narrow road.

But Jesus does not have his arms out to all people. He does not welcome all people.

This lie of the Pharisees, which became the One World Church is powerfully deceptive. And the objective of the One World Church (the Satanic Rebellion) is white genocide. And remember it looks real, sounds real and even feels real. And the deception does not make a big announcement to its intentions. It gently claims its converts - like the Siren would draw ancient sailor to their death by their beautiful voices.

The gentle voice of the One World Church will put you to sleep. Those of you who have ever been out on a lake fishing know how, if not anchored, your boat will slowly drift away. If you are not alert you may actually fall asleep by the gentle motion of the drift like I did in this photo taken as a small child. I went fishing with my folks. I was



determined to catch a fish - but the motion of the drift caused me to fall to sleep.

We have been called to be an over comer, to over-come all those obstacles that stand in our way. God has called us to finish the race. But He has also promised to give us the power to finish the race. He tells us in Matt. 28:20, "Lo, I

am with you always."

Also the Apostle Paul tells us in Ephesians 6:16, that if we are willing to take on the armor of God we will "be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked."

People can often stand against the roaring lion but they are unaware of the drift and they slowly drift away.

The drift is not alarming - it does not shout at us - it is so gentle - so very gentle - and then it captures you and you are asleep in the arms of the One World Church

No one wakes up in the morning and says - I quit - they just begin drifting

If we do not stay alert and keep fellowship with others then it can happen. It can happen to you - it can happen to your spouse, it can happen to your children - it can happen to me. END
